Strong form: æt; weak form: ət

The strong form is used mainly in sentence-final position (e.g. 'What are you playing at?'). It may also be used in sentence-initial position (e.g. 'At what time do you often get up?'). The weak form is / ət / (e.g. 'She's at home.' / ʃiz ət 'həum /; 'I'll see you at lunch.' / aɪl 'si: ju ət 'lʌntʃ /).
