## **Lesson Twenty-four There**

Strong form: ðeə<sup>r</sup>; weak form: ðə<sup>r</sup>

When this word has a demonstrative function, it always occurs in its strong form /ðeə / (ðeər before vowels), (e.g. **There** it is' / 'ðeər It 'IZ /; 'Put it **there**' / 'put It 'ðeə /). Weak form: / ðə / is used before consonants (e.g. **There** should be a rule' / ðə 'ʃud bi ə'ru: | /), and / ðər / before vowels (e.g. **There** is' / ðər 'IZ /). In final position the pronunciation may be / ðə / or / ðeə / (e.g. 'There isn't any, is **there**?' / ðər 'Iznt eni 'IZ ðə / or / ðər 'Iznt eni 'IZ ðə /).
