Lesson Twenty-five Can

Strong form: kæn; weak forms: kən, kn, kn

The strong form / kæn / is used for emphasis (e.g. 'You can do it'), and for contrast (e.g. 'I don't know if he can or he can't'). It is also used finally in a sentence (e.g. 'I don't know if I can'). Weak form: / kən / (e.g. 'They can wait' / 'ðeɪ kən 'weɪt /). The form / kŋ / occurs only before words beginning with / k / or / g /, (e.g. 'We can go' / wi kŋ l gəu/).
