Strong form: ∫æl; weak form: ∫<sup>ə</sup>l

The strong form is used for strong insistence or prediction (e.g. 'You **shall** go to the ball, Cinderella'), and also in final position (e.g. 'And so you **shall**'). The weak form is used elsewhere (e.g. 'What **shall** we do today?' /  $_1$ wpt  $\int^{9}$ lwi \_du: tə'deɪ /; 'We **shall** need to hurry' / wi  $\int_{1}^{1}$ 'ni: d tə 'hʌri /).
