Lesson Thirty-four Does

Strong form: dnz; weak form: dez

The strong form is used when 'does' occurs as a full verb, (e.g. 'That's what he does for a living'), for emphasis, (e.g. 'That does look nice') and for contrast (e.g. 'It does cost a lot, but it doesn't need repairing'). The strong form also occurs in final position (e.g. 'I don't like it as much as she does'). When 'does' occurs in other positions as an auxiliary, the weak form is normally used, (e.g. 'Why does it stop?' / war doz it 'stop /; 'When does it arrive?' / 'wen doz it o'raiv /).
