## Lesson Thirty-six Are

Strong form:  $\alpha_r^r$ ; weak form:  $\theta^r$ , occasionally weak form before vowels: r

The strong form /  $ax^r$  / is used for emphasis (e.g. 'you **are** stupid'), for contrast (e.g. 'you **are** rich, but you **aren't** handsome'). The weak form is usually /  $\theta^r$  / (e.g. 'These **are** mine' /  $_1\delta ix z \theta^r$  main /; before vowels: 'These are old' /  $_1\delta ix z \theta^r$   $\theta$  ould /; 'The coats **are** in there' /  $\delta\theta^r$  keuts  $\theta$  in ' $\delta\theta\theta$  /).
