Strong form: ðæt; weak form: ðət

When used demonstratively, it is always pronounced with its strong form / ðæt /. (e.g. 'I like that one.')

Weak form / ðət / is used more often than the strong form (e.g. 'The price is the thing that annoys me' / ðə 'praɪs ɪz ðə 'θɪŋ ðət ə 'nɔɪz mi /).
