Strong form: h3: r; Weak forms: h5r, 5r

The strong form / hs: r / is used for emphasis, (e.g. 'It was her fault') or contrast, (e.g. 'his or her bank'). There is weak form / hə r / which is used at the beginning of sentences, (e.g. 'Her train was late' / hə 'trein wəz leit/. / ə / before consonants (e.g. 'Take her home' / 'teik ə 'həum /) / ə r / before vowels (e.g. 'Take her out' / 'teik ər 'aut / and elsewhere in slow, careful speech, (e.g. 'I admired her skill' / ai əd maiəd hə 'skil/). In rapid speech the weak form is likely to be / ə / (e.g. 'Let her through', / let ə ' θ ru: /).
